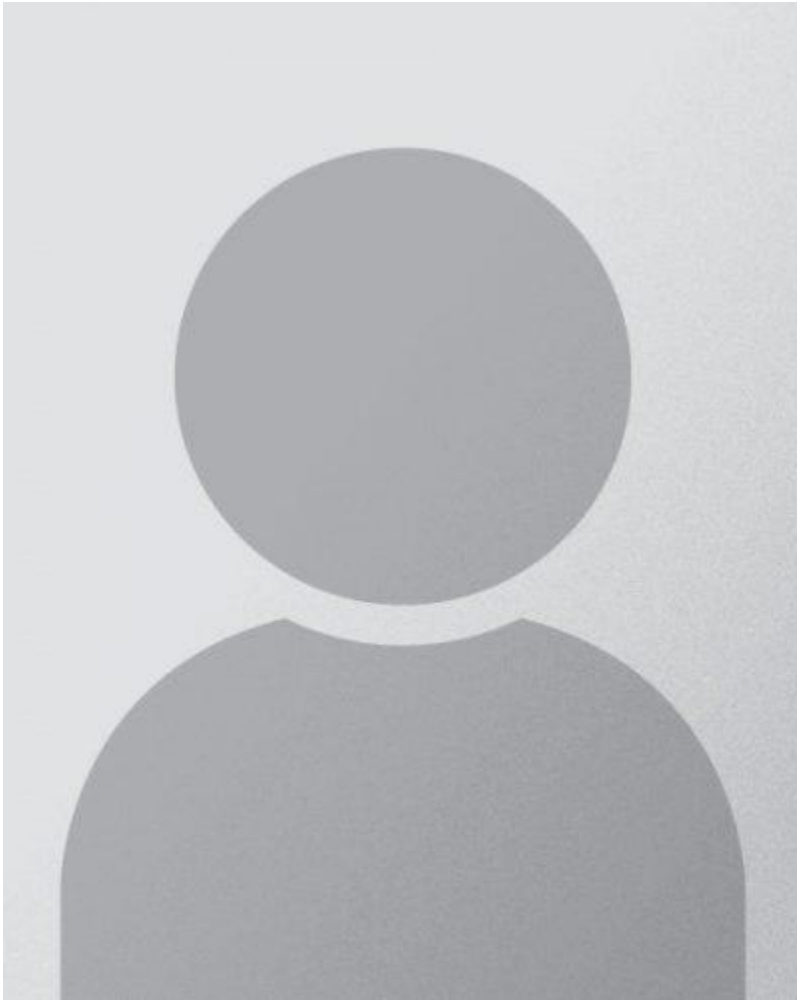


## Meet Our Officers
